Children in southern Madagascar face chronic malnutrition after years of drought. ... The children are already frail from the lack of consistent food, vitamins and minerals.

More than 58 percent Madagascar's people lack access to safe drinking water and nearly half of all households live without sanitation facilities. ... Improving local, community-based governance of water and sanitation resources.

GDP in Madagascar averaged 4.29 USD Billion from 1960 until 2019, reaching an all time high of 12.80 USD Billion in 2019 and a record low of 0.67 USD Billion in 1960.

Housing. Houses are typically rectangular and crowned with steeply angled roofs. In the rural areas, most houses are made of either mud and wattle or woven matting supported by poles. In the eastern forest, they are built of interlaced split bamboo and are thatched with palm. Estimated cost of living in Madagascar for a month without rent. Total cost of living in Madagascar for two person with average consumption for one month will be \$ 562.49, no rent price included

Madagascar's economic freedom score is 60.5, making its economy the 99th freest in the 2020 Index. Its overall score has increased by 3.9 points because of higher scores for judicial effectiveness and property rights. Madagascar is ranked 8th among 47 countries in the Sub-Saharan Africa region, and its overall score is well above the regional average and approximately equal to the world average



- The Canadian Bill of Rights, passed in 1960, was the first federal human rights law in Canada. It guarantees many basic rights and freedoms, including the "right of the individual to life, liberty, security of the person and enjoyment of property" and the right not to be deprived of any of those rights except in process," meaning basic procedural fairness.
